Student Expectations

Elementary school children need only the following three rules to understand their responsibilities and protect their rights. The three rules are:

1. Be Respectful.

- I will use the correct language, tone and voice volume.
- I will follow the directions, the first time given, of the adults in the school.
- I will treat myself, others, and all property with respect.

2. Be Responsible.

- I will attend school on time every day. If I am sick, my parents will call the school and send a written excuse when I return.
- I will be responsible for doing my school work carefully and on time.
- I will know the rules of the school in all settings and follow them.
- I will tell the truth.
- I will be responsible for my own property and be ready to work with all needed materials.
- I will be a good citizen and help others.

3. Be Safe.

- I will practice fire and tornado drills appropriately.
- I will use all school equipment correctly.
- I will keep my hands, feet and objects to myself.
- I will enter/exit school and bus in an orderly manner. (I will be quiet and walk.)
- I will request permission to leave any area.
- I will bring nothing to school that could harm or frighten someone (examples are: guns of any kind [real or toy] knives, firecrackers, Chinese stars, matches, lighters, etc.).
- I will dress appropriately for all weather conditions and, at the same time, follow the school dress code.

CONSEQUENCES:

If I do not follow the rules, the following steps may be taken:

1. I may have a conference with a teacher or other adult.
2. A phone contact may be made with my parents/guardian.
3. I may have a conference with the Principal.
4. Privileges may be taken away. I may serve a detention.
5. A conference may be held to discuss my behavior with my parent/guardian, teacher, principal, and me.
6. I may be referred to the Guidance Counselor.
7. I may be suspended from school or class.
8. A referral may be made to another agency, police, or juvenile court.
9. I may be expelled.

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
